
Walk from St Eanswith Church, Brenzett to St Dunstan Church, Snargate

A countryside walk visiting two historic medieval churches and an unspoilt, multi-room 16th century smugglers pub. Approximately 2.7 miles over flat terrain.

Start at St Eanswith Church, Brenzett. (see map) *Post Code* TN29 0BJ; OS *Grid Reference* TR0050527730

- The church is 10 minutes from the Stagecoach bus route 11A.
- If arriving by car, there is a small car park belonging to the church, so best to check with them first. (Church Warden 01797 344521)
- The church is normally locked. The key is with the Church Warden at King's Cottage on left of approach to church, 01797 344521, or at Rose Cottage on left of road towards Ashford.



At the rear (west) of the church grounds there is a stile leading to two footpaths. Take the right hand footpath over the field until you meet up with Church Lane. Follow the lane for a short distance and then, on a right hand bend, take the bridleway on the left, westwards.

Follow this bridleway for its full length, just over ½ mile, until you reach a lane with St Dunstan Church opposite.

 The church is normally open. If not, the key is available at the Red Lion Inn or from the Church Warden, Mr David Body, 01233 732412.

From the church, walk a few yards south along the lane, and you will see the Red Lion pub. The pub is the hidden gem of Romney Marsh; entering the pub and you are in a time warp, going back to the 1940s. Decorated with posters from the 1940s and the Womens Land Army, it has a nationally important historic pub interior. Well worth a visit if open.



To return to St Eanswith Church, you have two choices. You can either retrace your steps and return via the bridleway or walk eastwards from the pub along the B2080. But take care, as there is no footpath. When you come to a roundabout, turn left to return to the church. Or you can catch Stagecoach bus 11A back to Brenzett.
