Martello Towers

An Illustrated Guide



THE MARTELLO TOWERS, A FAMILIAR SIGHT ALONG THE SOUTH COAST, WERE INSPIRED BY THE TOWER AT MORTELLA POINT, CORSICA. IN 1794 THE BRITISH ATTRICKED THE ISLAND, OCCUPIED BY NAPOLEON'S TROOPS. TWO SHIPS BOMBARDED THE TOWER BUT WERE FORCED TO WITHDRAW AFTER SUSTAINING SERIOUS DAMAGE AND 60 CASUALTIES.



DESPITE CONTINOUS HEAVY FIRING,
THE TOWER HELD OUT FOR TWO MORE
DAYS. BOTH NAVAL AND MILITARY
OFFICERS WERE IMPRESSED BY
TOWER'S STRENGTH.



AFTER THE NAVY'S FAILURE, THE ARMY, UNDER THE COMMAND OF MAJOR-GENERAL DAVID DUNDAS, AND LIEUTENANT-GENERAL JOHN MORE LAID SIEGE TO THE TOWER A BATTERY OF FOUR GUNS WERE WAS PUSHED TO WITHIN 150 YARDS OF ITS WALLS

AT THE BEGINING OF THE 19TH CENTURY, MAPOLEON HAD BECOME SO POWERFUL THAT HE BEGAN THREATENING ENGLAND WITH INVASION. AT A CONFERENCE HELD AT ROCHESTER IT WAS DECIDED TO BUILD 73 MARTELLO TOWERS ALONG THE MOST VULNERABLE STRETCH OF COAST BETWEEN FOLKESTONE AND SERFORD W SUSSEX.



TO DISCOVER THE RIGHT
STRENGTH OF THE WALLS,
CANNON BALLS WERE
FIRED AT THEM LATIL A
STRENGTH WAS ACHIEVED
WHERE THEY BOUNCED OFF.

EACH TOWER HAP A GARRISON OF ONE OFFICER AND 2.4 MEN. ON THE ROOF WAS A 24 POUNDER CANNON WHICH COULD TRAVERSE A FULL CIRCLE, ENOUGH SUPPLIES WERE CONTRINED TO WITHSTAND A SIEGE,







IT HAS BEEN SUGGESTED THAT THE NAME MARTELLO, INSTEAD OF MORTELLA IS OF TALIAN ORIGIN. THERE WERE SIMILAR TOWERS IN TALLY CALLED TORI DI MARTELLO. MARTELLO IS TTALIAN FOR HAMMER EACH TOWER CONTAINED AN BELL WHICH WAS STRUCK WITH A HAMMER.


MARTELLO TOWERS WERE NOT REFERRED TO AS SUCH UNTIL 1803. PREVIOUSLY THEY WERE KNOWN SIMPLY AS SEA TOWERS, 'CORSICAN TOWERS' OR GOMB PROOF TOWERS

THE REMAINS OF A TYPICAL SOUTH COAST MARTELLO TOWER.


